**The Halifax Rules**

as recorded by James Power:

1. *The game was played with a block of wood for a puck.*
2. *The puck was not allowed to leave the ice.*
3. *The stones marking the place to score goals were placed on the ice (at right angles to those at present) parallel to the sides of the ice surface.*
4. *There was to be no slashing.*
5. *There was to be no lifting the stick above the shoulder.*
6. *When a goal was scored, teams changed ends.*
7. *Players had to keep 'on side' of the puck.*
8. *The 'forward pass' was permitted.*
9. *All players played the entire game.*
10. *There was a no-replacement rule for penalized players.*
11. *The game had two thirty minute periods with a ten minute break.*
12. *The goal-keeper had to stand for the entire game.*
13. *Goals were decided by the goal umpires, who stood at the goal mouth and rang a handbell.*

In his own words, these were the rules used as Colonel Weston and his friends played the game in the mid 1800s.
